



LATEST GOVERNMENT REGULATIONS TO FIGHT COVID 19 PROGRESSION

All previous measures taken by the club still remain,
The one stated below are now additional.

Please assist us in the most civil manner possible in their implementation, starting Saturday 28 March 2020 at 6pm, for a period of 14 days minimum.

1. The number of customers at any premises on which food or drink is sold or supplied for consumption on the premises (catering premises) at any one time must not exceed 50% of the normal seating capacity of the premises.

Maximum number of person using the main clubhouse food and beverage outlets is now 160 at any one time and 90 on Middle Island. Under the new regulations we must reserve our right to refuse entry should our capacity reach this level.

2. Tables available for use or being used by customers within any catering premises must be arranged in a way to ensure there is a distance of at least 1.5 meters or some form of partition which could serve as effective buffer between one table and another table at the premises.

This was already done a few days ago, please do not move tables around or join them together.

3. No more than 4 persons may be seated together at one table within any catering premise.

Please respect this seating arrangement imposed by the government. (New Club policy of maximum 2 guests is now in place).

4. A person must wear a mask at any time within any catering premises, except when the person is consuming food or drink on the premises

Please do so for your own protection, the protection of your family and friends and our staff.

USE AND BRING YOUR OWN MASKS.

5. Body temperature screening on a person must be conducted before the person is allowed to enter the catering premises.

Temperature will be taken at the main entrance of the club house at the reception and on top of Middle Island stairs. Should you record anything over 37.5 Degree Celsius we will ask you to leave the premises and advice you to stay home or visit a doctor should you have any symptoms such as dry cough, sniffles, sore throat, diarrhea or fever ?
