Biography

Biography

Rear Commodore Sailing - from 2013 to 2015 Commodore from 2015 to 2023

In standing for re-election to Gencom I should, as required by convention, highlight some personal details for those Members who do not yet know me or who otherwise may not be familiar.

A dinghy sailor from boyhood, Pooley has been a regular participant in HK yachting and racing since returning here in 1989. Currently a member of 2 overseas Yacht Clubs, RHKYC and Hebe Haven in addition to ABC and a member of the HKSF. Well known in the local yachting community and to flag officers of other yacht clubs.

Involved in some 25 Four Peaks Races initially as Skipper on Shearwater, more recently as a regular crew member, or assisting with Race Management 20 events as a runner.

A regular participant in all ABC race series from 1989 and numerous Regattas and offshore events in Asia:- Thailand, Philippines, Malaysia and China Sea crossings; occasionally in UK. A regular participant in Protest Hearings.

As Commodore Pooley has managed to attend most sub-Committee meetings on a regular basis and found much interest in doing so.
