



ABC Commodore's: Welcome Message

Once again, with the slot now well established, ABC has secured the last weekend in September for the Regatta in the hope that in this era of fickle weather patterns the NE Monsoon will have set in and favour sailors over the weekend.

As the eponymous title implies, this event heralds the start of HK's best yacht-racing season with favourable, reliable, not infrequently strong, winds through to April. As such it is an Open Regatta which welcomes the crews of all insured keelboats in HK holding a recognised handicap and which ABC is happy, keen, and proud to host. The established format is unchanged, but details vary annually hence the need for skippers to read digest and follow the instructions.

The Divisional splits aim to provide all boats, including the Cape 31 Class----the sleekest and fastest as well as the graceful older ladies---with a chance, as equal as it can ever be at sea, of a podium position. Notwithstanding that chance, the underlying rationale is to provide an entertaining, even exhilarating, healthy and safe weekend of fun afloat. Rounded off with the celebratory prize-giving on Middle Island----hard to think of a better way to spend a weekend!

This year we welcome the support of a new supporting sponsor, **Potique/Gateway** form Vietnam offering prizes of getaway hotel nights. Aberdeen Boat Club Opening Yacht Regatta 2025

Notice of Race

Saturday 27th and Sunday 28th September

The Regatta Organising Authority is the Aberdeen Boat Club under the auspices of the Sailing Federation of Hong Kong, China.

1. Rules

- 1.1 The Regatta will be governed by the 'Rules' as defined in the Racing Rules of Sailing (RRS) 2024 - 2028.
- 1.2 The Prescriptions of the Sailing Federation of Hong Kong, China (SFHKC) will apply, together with:
 - The 2025 IRC Rules, Parts A, B and C (IRC Rule 22.4 shall not apply). There will be no limitations on crew numbers or weight;
 - with the exception of single handed, shorthanded yachts or keelboat entries without accommodation, which are not acceptable;
 - the PHS rating: <https://www.sailsys.com.au/>;
 - the World Sailing Special Regulations Category 4 - Appendix B, Inshore Racing plus VHF radio; except that the requirement to be self-righting will not apply to the Multihulls;
 - Class Association rules of competing classes – e.g., Cape 31;J – 80;
 - Multi-hulls will be considered on a case-by-case basis by the Race Committee for the Sunday Islands Race only;
 - this Notice of Race (NoR) and the ABC SSI's 2025 Edition.
- 1.3 In case of conflict between any of the above, succeeding items take precedence. This changes RRS 63.7.
- 1.4 For the purposes of IRC Rule 21.1.5 (d) & (e) the regatta is run on consecutive days. Replacement sails may be permitted during the regatta in exceptional circumstances with the permission of the Race Committee. A replacement sail will only be permitted if it is of similar cloth weight, area, and design.

- 1.5 If the Protest Committee decides that a boat which is party to a protest has broken a rule and is not exonerated, it may impose a scoring penalty (which may be no penalty) at its discretion, as an alternative to disqualification. This changes RRS 64.1.
- 1.6 This NoR may be amended by the ABC SSI 2025 Edition and/or an Opening Regatta Notice to Competitors (NTC).

2. Advertising

- 2.1 Boats may be required to display the regatta sponsor's advertising chosen and supplied by the organising authority.
- 2.2 World Sailing Regulation 20 will apply for Competitors boat/crew wear displayed during the event.

3 Eligibility and Entry

- 3.1 The regatta is open to the following classes and boats:

3.1.1 Class or division of Class

- Yacht IRC Class/divisions – Rating split – to be announced.
- Cape 31/IRC Class.
- Yacht PHS Class/divisions – Rating split – to be announced.
- Multi – hulls will race in the PHS Division A.
- Day Keelboats with accommodation, such as J 80's, will race under PHS but must have a rating registered on the SailSys website.

- 3.2 Boats from other classes may also be considered by the Race Committee on application, by 1700 hrs on Wednesday 24th September 25.
- 3.3 The final regatta divisional splits will be allocated by the Race Committee in a Notice to Competitors (NTC # 1) subject to entries received and in the interests of fair racing, by 1700 hrs. on Thursday 25th September 25.
- 3.4 A boat will be entered in one class only. The IRC and PHS Classes will be divided into suitable rating bands depending on the number of entries received.
- 3.5 A class or division will consist of a three-boat minimum for all classes.
- 3.6 All boats must be in the vicinity of the starting line at its class warning signal to be eligible for the Regatta.
- 3.7 Eligible boats are yachts which have valid IRC 2025 Certificates or PHS ratings and other seaworthy boats at the discretion of the Race Committee.
- 3.8 Boats without valid 2025 IRC or PHS ratings may be accepted by at the discretion of the Race Committee. Any such allocation will not be subject to protest. Valid 2025 IRC & PHS ratings will be listed as published on the current Sailsys website by 1700 hrs. on Wednesday 24th September 25.
- 3.9 Entry may be made by submitting a completed online entry form (available at https://www.abclubhk.com/opening_yachtregatta_2025.aspx) before 1700 hrs. on Wednesday 24th September 25. Late entries may be accepted at the discretion of the Race Committee but will be subject to an additional late entry fee of \$250 HKD.
- 3.10 Class lists will be published on the event website no later than 1700 hrs. on Thursday 25th September 25.

4. **Entry Fees**

The entry fees will be as follows:

5. **Schedule and Course Locations**

5.1 **Saturday:**

- IRC Yacht & Cape 31 divisions up to **three** windward/leeward races; PHS Yachts/keel boats divisions: up to **two or three*** windward / leeward races in the Lamma sailing area.
- (* to be determined by the Race Committee and/or Race Officer considering demand, weather, and/or wind conditions).
- The scheduled time for the first warning signal will not be before: **1055 hrs.**

5.2 **Sunday:**

- IRC Yachts & Cape 31 divisions, PHS Yachts/keel boats/Multi – hulls - an Island course.
- The start area will be determined by the Race Committee and/or Race Officer depending on the weather conditions and ABC's designated sailing areas on each day of the regatta.
- The start area for all divisions will be posted on the regatta website by 0900 hrs on the day of racing.
- The scheduled time for the first warning signal will not be before: **1055 hrs.**

6. **Measurements**

6.1 Boats entering the IRC & Cape 31 divisions shall submit a copy of their current IRC 2025 certificate to the Sailsys website no later than 1800 hrs. on Wednesday 24th September 2025.

6.2 No alteration to a boat's TCC will be permitted after this date, except because of a rating protest or to correct Rating Authority errors.

7. **Sailing Instructions**

The event will be sailed under the ABC SSI's 2025 Edition which can be downloaded at: https://www.abclubhk.com//annual_events.aspx

8. **Venue**

The organising authority will use the ABC main club house and Middle Island club house. Racing will take place to the South, East and West of Hong Kong Island.

9. **Penalty & Arbitration**

9.1 Prior to a protest hearing an Arbitration Hearing may be offered in accordance with Appendix T as modified in NoR 10.2. If an arbitration hearing is not available, a boat may nonetheless take a postrace penalty as defined in NoR 10.2. (This changes Appendix T2.)

9.2 A boat may take a penalty at the time of the incident as per RRS 44.1.

9.3 Provided that rule 44.1(b) does not apply, a boat that may have broken one or more rules of Part 2 or Rule: 31 in an incident may take a Post-Race Penalty at any time after the race until the beginning of a protest hearing involving the incident, in accordance with Appendix T, as modified below:

- 9.4 (a) The Post-Race Penalty is a 20% Scoring Penalty except the minimum scoring penalty shall be three (3) places. (This changes Appendix T1.b.).
- (b) A boat takes a Post-Race Penalty by notifying a member of the race committee, or for incidents resulting in a protest, an arbitrator, or a member of the protest committee in writing that she accepts a scoring penalty. (This changes Appendix T1 (c) and Appendix A.5).
- (c) Arbitration Process of Appendix T2 - 4 may be offered for each incident resulting in a protest by a boat. (This changes Appendix T2).
- 9.5 The protest time limit for all boats is 90 minutes after the last boat finishes racing, in the last race of the day, on both days of the regatta.
- 9.6 RRS rule - Appendix A - Clause 5.3 will apply.
- 10. Scoring**
- 10.1 Boats will be scored according to their IRC or PHS ratings, depending on the class entered.
- 10.2 Yachts and multi-hull divisions: Scoring all races will count equally, with no discards.
- 11. Safety & Support Boats.**
- 11.1 While racing, **no exposed anchors or large bow rollers** shall be carried on deck forward of the bow, unless enclosed by the hull or a fixed bowsprit.
- 11.2 All boats shall carry adequate lifesaving and PFD equipment **for all** persons onboard.
- 11.3 ABC support boats may be suitably marked with the sponsors or event branding.
- 12. Berthing & Moorings**
- Subject to availability, temporary moorings can be provided, in either Deepwater Bay or Aberdeen Typhoon Shelter for boats wishing to stay overnight before or after the race. Details may be obtained from the Club on 2552 8182 (Ext. 834) or by emailing to marinecoord@abclubhk.com. Space booking is required but not guaranteed.
- 13. Minimum Safety Requirement**
- Boats must comply with their class rules regarding safety requirements and Cruisers must comply with the World Sailing Special Regulation Category 4: Appendix B – Inshore Racing plus VHF Radio: <http://www.sailing.org/documents/offshorespecialregs/index.php>
- 14. Radio Communications**
- 14.1 Communications between the Race Committee and competitors will be on Marine VHF Channel 72. This applies to all competing boats in the regatta.
- 14.2 Except in an emergency, a boat shall neither make radio transmissions while racing nor receive radio communications not available to all boats. This restriction also applies to mobile telephones.
- 15. Prizes**
- 15.1 The Opening Yacht Regatta 2025 Trophies will be awarded to boats placed overall first, second and third places for each class, depending on the number of entries and class entered – e.g., either IRC or PHS Divisions.
- 15.2 A Line Honours prize will be awarded to the first boat in each Division or class to finish the Island Course on Sunday 28th September 25.

16. Prize Giving

Prizes will be awarded at the ABC Middle Island clubhouse on Sunday after racing, subject to any outstanding protest hearings.

17. Disclaimer of Liability

17.1 The Aberdeen Boat Club, the Organising Committee, the Race Committee, Regatta Sponsors and their respective representatives, Officers, Members, Staff and Volunteers accept no liability whatsoever for any loss of life or property, personal injury and damage caused by, or arising out of the Regatta.

17.2 The responsibility for a boat's decision to participate in a race or to continue racing is hers alone. (RRS Fundamental Rule 3). In addition, competitor's attention is drawn to the World Sailing Special Regulations 1.02.1 (first point) which begins "Under RRS 3, the responsibility for a boat's decision to participate in a race or continue racing is hers alone. The safety of a boat and her crew is the sole and inescapable responsibility of the Person-in-charge..." Competitors participate in the regatta entirely at their own risk.

17.3 Owners and skippers are invited to co-operate with the Organising Authority, Race Committee and ABC Marine & Sailing Office in completing the formalities of their boat entries by submission of all required information, certificates, forms, etc. within the deadline dates quoted throughout this NoR. Failure to comply will result in a boat not entering the series correctly and will require supporting evidence to be presented to the race committee to comply.

18. Insurance

Entered boats shall have third party liability insurance at least to the minimum cover required under Hong Kong SAR law.

19. Food and Beverage Arrangement

A breakfast buffet will be available at the main clubhouse from 0800hrs on Sunday 28th September: early bird – 0800 to 0900 hrs: \$95 HKD, after 0900 hrs: \$105 HKD.

20. Further Information

20.1 Car Parking

Car parking is not available for visitors on race days. Other public car parks are opposite the main club above the bus station and the Jumbo Car Park on Welfare Road.

20.2 Club Signing Rights

Visiting competitors from the Royal Hong Kong Yacht Club and Hebe Haven Yacht Club may sign chits on the race day on presentation of their club membership card.

20.3 Food and Beverage

Non-member competitors may use Octopus Cards at the Coffee shop and at ABC MI, which are valid for use only on the designated race days and prize giving presentation.

20.4 Ships Stores & Fuel

Drinks and ice are available from the Galley on the day of the race and the takeaway food requires pre-order the day before. Diesel Fuel is obtainable from Fuegy Fuel Barge located at the western entrance of the Aberdeen Harbour or the Aberdeen Marina Club fuel pier.
